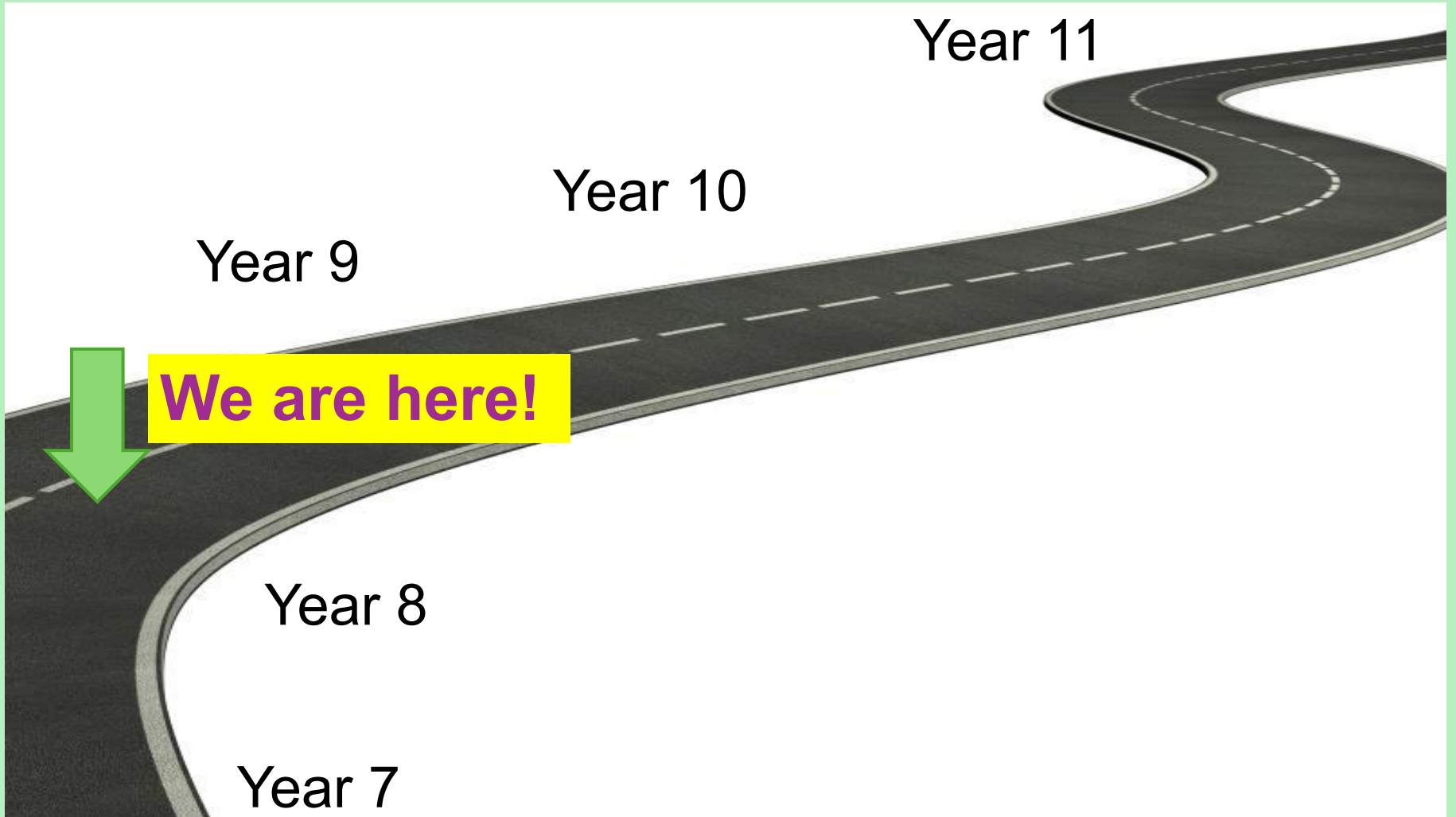

One of the things that makes Baysgarth unique and special is our determination to give our students a broad, balanced and varied curriculum which gives opportunities over and above those students will receive in other schools.

Because our teachers are so effective and our students well-motivated, we can cover the elements of the compulsory Key Stage 3 National Curriculum in Years 7 and 8. We allow two years for our students to cover their GCSE courses from Easter of Year 9 to Easter of Year 11, with time to revise and prepare for their exams in the summer term of Year 11.

This allows us two terms in Year 9 where we do not have to follow the compulsory elements of the school curriculum and can deliver an exciting and innovative programme that is both unique and enriching.

We call this curriculum Gateway and it is based on the belief that our teachers can deliver outstanding lessons in areas of their specialisms, skills and interests, and our students get to learn the critical employability skills that will support them to be successful later in life.

It's not all a free choice...

To ensure all pupils receive a broad and balanced curriculum the government has said that all students must take the following subjects:

GCSE English
GCSE Mathematics
GCSE Science
1 hour of PE/PHSE per week



The Core Curriculum (The Non-Negotiables)

Before you make your choices, remember that everyone will continue to study the core subjects that employers and universities value most:

- **English Language & Literature**
- **Science** (Combined)
- **Core PE & PSHE** (Personal Development)
- **Mathematics + Statistics**
 - *Note:* All students will study **Statistics** alongside Mathematics. This provides an extra GCSE qualification and vital data-analysis skills needed for the modern workplace.

What are Pathways?

Options run two pathways, A and B.

Pathway A is our Triple Science pathway, and those placed on this pathway have the best chance of success completing three Science GCSEs. The decision to be placed on this pathway is made based upon your assessment over the course of your time at Baysgarth. 14 hours a fortnight. 10.5 hours of exams.

Pathway B is for those not doing Triple Science. Students will still study Science and receive 2 GCSEs. 9 hours a fortnight. 7.5 hours of exams.

Step 1 - The "Breadth" Choices

You must choose **TWO** subjects from the categories below to ensure a balanced education. **The Golden Rule:** You can only pick **ONE** subject from any single category.

*(Example: You could pick Geography + Art. You **cannot** pick History + Geography).*

Category A: Humanities

- History
- Geography
- Religious Studies

Category B: Creative Arts

- Art, Textiles, or Graphics
- Photography
- Music, Drama, or Dance

Category C: Languages

- German

Options letters sent to parents with information regarding Options.

Options website goes live where parents can find information about each subject.

Tuesday 20th January

Options fair in school for Year 8. Students will visit departments and gather information on new subjects before completing their choices for taster sessions.

Wednesday 4th February

Options taster lessons.

Options form released to students and parents.

Sunday 22nd February

Deadline for all final Curriculum Option forms to be submitted online.

Monday 9th March

Option blocks will be constructed in the school timetable.

End of March

Confirmation of your final option choices by letter. At this point pupils who are unhappy with their options will have a chance to re-select from the option blocks which have been created.

April

All pupils' options will be finalised and confirmed by letter.

Option Choice Form

Students will be sent the option choice form after their tester sessions, which looks like the below. The form goes through three pages, in line with the option categories from the previous slides.

Forms can only be completed when logged onto their Baysgarth School Google account, and can only be completed once. If your child changes their mind afterwards, they can contact the Data Office on the second floor.

Other Important Points

There's a chance that not every course will run or that some course will be at capacity, so some students may be disappointed that they haven't received their first choices. **Take care over your reserve choices as they may be the courses you end up studying!**

You are not 'fixed' in this pathway. If you really want to do **triple science** or have been selected for **triple science** but do not want to do it, **please talk to me or Mrs Dolby (Head of Science.)**

Remember, students are allowed to change their options until April in Year 9. So even if you decide you've made a mistake with an option choice, you won't be stuck in that subject.
